<b>English</b>	Use some of the spellings overleaf to write some sentences. Try to incorporate interesting vocabulary and conjunctions into your writing.	Create a poster about prefixes or suffixes. Remember a prefix goes at the beginning of the word to change the meaning and the suffix goes at the end of a word to change the meaning.	Write a diary entry of a person who lived during the time of The Vikings. You may need to do some research to find out some information.	Make a list of interesting adjectives, powerful verbs and adverbs to describe one of the following <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Scenes from the invasion</li> <li>• Invasion boats landing on the beach</li> <li>• Anglo Saxon soldiers</li> <li>• An Anglo Saxon villa</li> </ul>	Write your very own rags to riches tale. Remember to include: an opening, build-up, problem, resolution and ending.
<b>Maths</b>	Write as many doubling facts as you can. Now write the corresponding halving facts. Learn the facts and time yourself to see how quickly you can recall them.	Play the rounding in a row game. (see additional sheet) You will need dice or you could create a spinner to play.	Calculate the perimeter of items in your home. For example: your living room rug, your dining table, a cereal box or maybe somewhere bigger like your garden.	Complete some multiplication calculations. Multiply two or three digit numbers by a one digit number. Try these first and show your working out: 35 x 2 24 x 4 52 x 5 125 x 3	Create your own multiplication word problems to test your teacher. For example; In a batch of cakes, there are 4 vanilla flavoured ones. John wants 20 vanilla cakes. How many batches would he need to bake?
<b>Theme</b>	Create a Viking word search, include these words: Viking, longboat, axe, shield, sword, helmet, archer, king, freeman, slave, coins, Yorvik, Danelaw, Wessex.	How is a Viking home different to a modern home? What is it made of? If you were going to improve a Viking home, what would you change or include?	Create your own Viking God. Why are they worshipped and what is the story of how they came to be?	Draw a map showing the Viking invasions and settlements.	Create your most inventive model of a Viking longboat!

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### Spelling Patterns for the Term - **Year 3 and 4**

- **Words where the k sound is spelt using the letters ch-** scheme, chorus, chemist, echo, character.
- **Words where the sh sound is spelt using the letters ch-** chef, chalet, machine, brochure.
- **Words ending in g spelt using the letters gue/que-** league, tongue, antique, unique.
- **Words where the s sound is spelt using the letter sc-** science, scene, discipline, fascinate, crescent

**Times tables-** Children should be able to recall multiplication and related division facts in any order.

By the end of Year 4 children should know and recall multiplication facts for all the times tables up to and including 12 x 12.
