Please choose at least one activity to complete each week in your homework book. Homework will be set every Thursday and collected in the following Monday. You are expected to complete phonics or spelling work each week, weekly reading (at least 3 times per week) and times tables work activities weekly too.

English	Write some multi-clause sentences about Ancient Greece. Underline the clauses in your sentence.	Read a book of your choice and write or record a book review.	Find out about one of the Greek myths or legends. Rewrite the story in less than 100 words.	Create an information page or teaching resource all about Ancient Greece. This could be a game, online resource or a Powerpoint.	Write a meeting tale. Remember to include: an opening, build-up, problem, resolution and ending.
Maths	Choose five items from a shopping receipt. Calculate the total cost OF those items and the change that you would receive from either a £5, £10 or £20 note.	Create an Olympic sporting event where you must consider the area that each event would take place. Calculate the area of the spaces needed. Include spaces for different sports and seating.	Calculate these fractions of amounts: $\frac{1}{4}$ of 36 $\frac{1}{3}$ of 39 $\frac{1}{5}$ of 75 $\frac{1}{8}$ of 56 $\frac{1}{7}$ of 49 $\frac{1}{10}$ of 120 $\frac{1}{6}$ of 42 $\frac{1}{9}$ of 81.	Research a question of your choice and ask your family and friends their preferences. For example, what is the most popular colour of cars? Gather your data in a table and create a block graph to present your data. Extension: explain what you have found out from your data.	Write your own maths problems involving fractions. For example; There were 27 cookies in a jar. $\frac{1}{3}$ of them are eaten. How many were eaten? How many are left in the jar?
Theme	Conduct some research to find out about the different uses for Ancient Greek pottery. Design a celebration pot.	How is life in Ancient Greece different to that in modern day Greece? Find out the differences and present them in your own way.	Find out about the different Greek Gods/goddesses. Who were they? What were they the god/goddess of?	Find out about the Olympic games in ancient Greece. Make a poster that could have been used at the time to advertise the Olympics.	Find out about life in modern day Greece. Create a leaflet persuading people to go there on holiday. You might want to include information about the food, weather, place to visit etc.

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Spelling Patterns for the Term -

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- **Words where the I sound is spelt ei, eigh, or ey** - vein, weigh, eight, neighbour, they, obey
- **Possessive apostrophe with plural words** - girls', boys', babies', children's, men's, mice'
- **Homophones and near-homophones**- accept/except, affect/effect, ball/bawl, berry/bury, brake/break, fair/fare, grate/great, groan/grown, here/hear, heel/heal/he'll, knot/not, mail/male, main/mane, meat/meet, medal/meddle, missed/mist, peace/piece, plain/plane, rain/rein/reign, scene/seen, weather/whether, whose/who's
