You will find attached a flyer about a mufti on Friday for Chocolate donations for the RWSA.





We have also been working on adding two numbers together and even tried a spot of doubling!

Year 1

This term we have been learning about plants and their flowers, as well as trees! This week we learnt and labelled all the different parts of a tree and explored what each of their jobs are!

Next week, we will be identifying different types of trees and seeing how many we have in our school grounds!



Year 2

This week we have been working on innovating our story of The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch. We have looked at the structure of the story and used this to create our own stories. We have also been learning how to punctuate dialogue correctly using inverted commas and adding information for the reader by using interesting verbs to replace 'said'.

Our stories have included aliens, footballers, fairies and clowns. Ask your child to retell their story to you.

Year 3

This week in History we learnt all about the people who resisted the Roman invasion, this included learning about brave Boudicca who led an army.

In Science we have been furthering our knowledge of magnets and we have learnt about which materials are magnetic.


This week in Science, Year 4 have been learning about the digestive system. We discussed the role of the mouth, stomach and intestines. The children found out that an adult stomach hold 60ml of liquid when empty and up to 1000ml when full; we explored this by filling a bag with water to compare the difference. We then found out that the small intestine is around 7m long; we compared objects outside to see if they were shorter or longer than the small intestine.





