This week in year 3 we have been using the knowledge we have gained across the curriculum this term to create some amazing pieces of writing.

In science we applied the knowledge we have gained about forces and magnets, to create an information text.

This week as part of our reading sessions we have been focusing on Chinese New Year. We explored the story behind how the animal years were decided. We also looked at non-fiction texts to find out about some of the traditions which Chinese people take part in as part of their celebrations. The children liked the idea of celebrating new year for 15 days!



This week Year 5 have been getting up to all sorts! We have been working on creating our own 'Defeating a Monster' tales after working really hard to innovate on the model text, we have been adding to our knowledge displays for space in Science and we have been working hard on our multiplication skills in Maths!

We have also been talking a lot about road saftey and keeping ourselves safe outside in the dark. We have been looking at designs for items of clothing and coming up with our own that include fluorescent colours, reflective strips and lights, then thinking about who would use which items and how it could keep them safe.

Year 6 have rounded off Term 3 in true style, with highly focused learning. We have been writing our 'change tales' based on bullying. The children have worked incredibly hard on these and have often been reluctant to put their pens down – some budding authors in the making.

Fractions have been order of the day in maths, and the children can now multiply and divide fractions – they are making really great progress.

Our geography, this week became very explosive when we learnt about how volcanoes are formed. We watched some fascinating videos with volcanoes erupting. Year 6 were full of so many questions; they really are a curious bunch.
