Principal's message

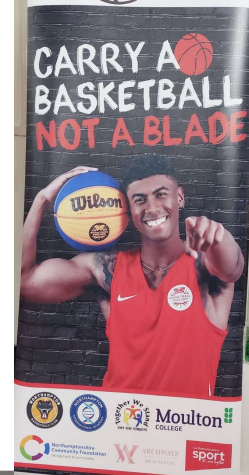

Year 2 have shown amazing resilience this week as we have started our DT project. We are looking at re-purposing clothing and have been exploring patchwork and applique techniques.

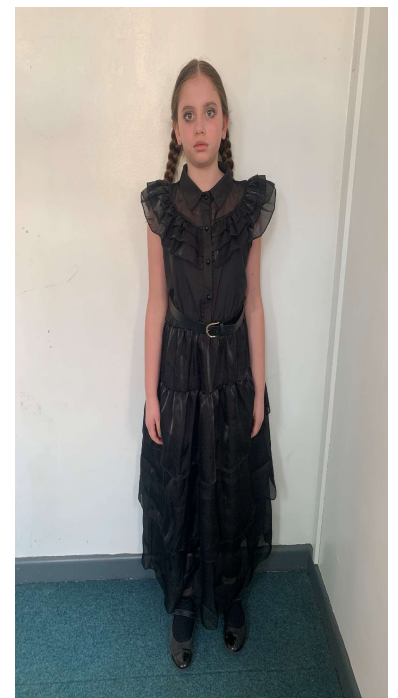
The children have created a template to use to help them create patchwork patches and have designed their own patchwork pattern using old newspaper. They have also begun to use an overstitch to join together pieces of material.

All this and carrying with their curriculum lessons – we couldn't be more proud of the effort the students have been making this week.

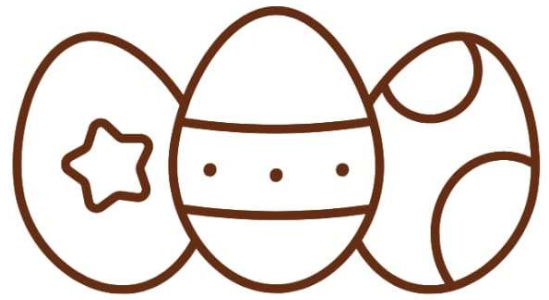
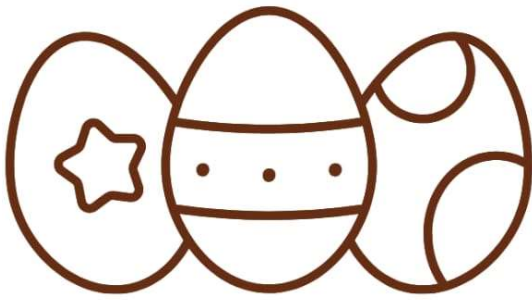
