

In Art we have been exploring collaging. We have used a variety of materials to create abstract collages. We have been inspired by the artist Katie Vernon who uses her knowledge of being a florist to help her create collages using flowers.








Year 3 had an awesome time this week setting up an experiment to show how water is transported through flowers.



In Science this week, Year 4 have been exploring which materials are conductors of electricity and which are insulators of electricity. We found out that stainless steel and foil conduct electricity and make our simple series circuits complete by the light bulb illuminating. We also found out that paper, foam and wood do not allow the electricity to flow through, therefore they are insulators.



Year 5 have been very busy this week! We have been innovating our own report about Mountain Giants, we will be creating our own report on mythical creatures next week and we can't wait to see the children's ideas!

We have also been honing our mathematical skills with fractions. It has been tricky at times but the children have shown great resilience and perseverance to understand the concepts.

We have our last swimming session next week (Thursday 28th) so please make sure your child has their swimming kit with them for the all important assessment week!

Year 6 have been creatively crafting three dimensional art work this week as we were inspired by the work of Dale Chihuly. We had lots of smiling faces as we shared feedback of their mock SAT experience. Lunches – Summer Term 1




We also have a special Italian theme day on Thursday 16th May where lunchtime will be all things Italian.
