



Remote Learning at Windmill Primary School

January 2021

Whilst we are all staying home and staying safe, we will continue to teach all our children using daily Teams calls. There will be three Teams calls each day to help teachers and children to keep in touch.

The sessions will enable the children to have teaching linked to the learning activities set on the weekly plan. The teacher will explain the task and, in later sessions, give the children feedback.

If your child cannot access every session, please do not worry. We will be recording and uploading the sessions so children can view them at a later time – or a second time if needed!

All online learning sessions will be the same as those being taught in school to key worker children.

To access online learning:

- Please log onto Microsoft Teams – there is a leaflet on our website to help with this. Usernames and passwords have been shared with you, and passwords can be set to something memorable to your child.
- You can access the learning plan and resources for the week on our website
- Please go to the Windmill Primary School website and go to the 'Curriculum' menu, and then select 'Home Learning'
- The work for your child will be found under the relevant year group
- Teachers have provided daily English, Maths and Foundation (theme) lessons as well as a range of other learning activities that your child can complete
- Work should be submitted for assessment using the Assignment function on Teams (year 1-6) on via Tapestry (Early Years)
- Your child's teacher will provide feedback on the work completed so that you can celebrate successes and you child knows the next steps to continue to improve
- All children will have the opportunity see their teacher regularly throughout the week

If you are unable to access learning online, please contact your child's class teacher for a paper pack. We will then make this available to collect from the office. Please request a pack before coming to school so we can have this ready for you.

Please get in touch with your child's class teacher if you need any advice or support during remote learning.



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Online teaching will follow the same principles as set out in the NET code of conduct.

Windmill Primary School will ensure any use of online learning tools and systems is in line with privacy and data protection/GDPR requirements.
